

PASTOR'S PAGE

In 2022, I decided to put together a devotional resource for use during the Advent season. I called it "I Wonder So I Wander" which was a play on the title of the old Christmas hymn "I Wonder as I Wander." I decided to reflect on some of the tough questions found in scripture and on some of the sacred spaces in my life that helped me to respond to those tough questions. The response to the devotional was wonderful. So, I decided to repeat the process again this year.

I started writing the new devotional in March of this year, and I am very excited to share the second volume with you. As with last year, I reflect on some of the tough questions found in scripture (all of which are different from the questions I considered last year). And I considered some different spaces not mentioned last year as I reflected on those questions. I have titled this second volume "I Still Wonder So I Still Wander." I hope you will join me on the continuation of this journey.

This year, Advent will start on Sunday, December 3, and it will continue through Sunday, December 24. As with last year, I will be making this resource available to everyone in multiples formats in the hopes that you will find it easier to use. A hard copy, with all of the devotions for each day, printed in one place, will be available for you to pick up starting on Sunday, November 19. I will also be emailing everyone a pdf version to be used on your computers on or about that same day. In addition, the plan will be to send out individual emails each day during the season with the devotion for the day available for you in an email format. And, in each of those individual emails, I will be including a link to a YouTube video that you can watch which will feature me reading each individual devotion in my own voice. It is my hope that, by providing a variety of formats, I might make it easier for you to participate in this activity.

As with last year, it is also my hope that you would be willing to share this resource with friends and family if you think might be beneficial for them. You can feel free to pick them up a copy of the devotion at church to give to them, forward your pdf version to them, forward the daily emails that I will send, and/or encourage them to go to our Facebook page during the season to find the daily links where the text will be available for them to read and the link will be available for them click in order to listen to me read the devotion (if that is preferable). Beginning on or around Sunday, November 26, I will be making the introduction to the series and the first one or two devotions available early for your viewing/listening. All of the other recorded devotions will be available starting at about 6:00 p.m. the evening before their date so that they will be ready for you the next morning, just in case you are an early riser and an early reader. There is even a bonus devotion for Christmas Day in the collection.

CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

This newsletter for November and December covers Thanksgiving and Christmas. Appropriate that we are both thankful and hopeful about the future.

The council meetings always cover 3 time periods. We look back over the prior month (accomplishments and financial statements). We look forward to the near future. And we look further forward to the long term. In our next meeting, we will begin to talk about the 2024 budget. In that discussion, we will talk about where we are financially this year (we will have the financial statements for October), and we will have to look forward through December of 2024. The practical realities will be discussed and will be balanced wit our hope for the future.

Again these 2 months present a time we can reflect upon how much we have to be thankful for and how hopeful (maybe anxious) we are about the future.

Cathy Zacher provided this:

"It has become clearer to me that when we spend too much energy focusing on the past, we become unable to leave it. We can get caught in the "golden era" as we romanticize years gone by. From our own personal lives to even our experience of church, living in the past robs us of the grace of the present moment. In the end, wisdom, joy, goodness and holiness are available to us when we live in the NOW with the eyes of our hearts and minds fixed firmly on Jesus. Simply put, there is no "perfect church" out there. The opportunity for us is to grow where God has planted us and make this church family the best that it can be."

GOOD NEWS IN ACTION COMMITTEE

Our quarterly mission for the third quarter was the Urban Ecology Center in Milwaukee with its three facilities which help get youth and others become aware of nature in their own back yards. We contributed \$1574.00 for which they have been most grateful!

Our fourth quarter mission is the Franciscan Peacemakers in Milwaukee. Deacon Steve Predbelski and his assistant, Mary Elizabeth brought items made by victims of human trafficking, abuse, sexual exploitation, and addiction. Cynthia, a previous victim gave a great story of her abuse and now helped by Franciscan Peacemakers during the temple talk on September 22nd. There is a bulletin board on the east wall of Bruemmer Hall with leaflets on the table in the narthex.

The St. Vincent de Paul meal program, which Memorial has been involved with ever since its inception in 1984 is ending for Memorial on November 5th. We have been involved for 391/2 years and it is now time for an ending. We have enjoyed doing it for this long, but we have not been able to get enough servers. Our casserole makers have been most helpful and faithful. The monthly number of people served on the first Sunday of the month is about 110. We are encouraged that St. Margaret Mary catholic church is somewhat interested in the program and we will give them all the encouragement we can. We will supply the program with \$250 to \$300 a month from people in our congregation who want to help the program continue for one year.

The Christmas Basket program Memorial has been involved in for over 45 years with Hephatha Lutheran Church located on 18th and Locust, one of our sister churches, will change. Instead of spending \$1500.00 for ten families with a variety of food, we will give the recipients a card for \$150 which they can use at their convenience. Buying all the food, putting together boxes for delivery and making the deliveries has been a big job and ended up with too much of the work falling on so few. We definitely want to continue the "basket" program, but it will continue in a different way. We still think this is a wonderful way to have an outreach to our inner-city people at Hephatha and we hope you do, too. Please put in your offering for Christmas Baskets and we will put that toward the program which we will continue to do but in a different manner.
